



EXAMPLES FOR THE TRAINER

Bad luck is bad luck. Imagine a very ambitious team that submits many projects and grants for co-financing in their company. The day of the next bid and the date of submitting the application for funding comes.

The work of the whole team is two weeks of intensive work, many hours on the concept and details of the form. The constant struggle with the generator. But you never know in this situation whether something will come of it, whether it will be possible to obtain new funds, new opportunities for action. The most common problem that writing teams face at the end of submitting an application is time, or rather the lack of it.

They often work together, but in a dispersed team. One person works in Gdańsk, another in Szczecin, the third person supports the team, but in an international context from Ireland. It's hard to get the team together at the same time. Their work is also individual - some work during the day, others at night, and only one person works early in the morning.

In such a situation, it is important to know your time ranges, but also to plan tasks with a time buffer, because the deadline for submitting the application is generally rarely postponed.
