PRE-EVALUATION TEST: KNOWLEDGE OF THE SOCIAL SOLIDARITY METHOD

- 3 = neutral
- 4 = agree
- 5 = strongly agree

2. Social solidarity helps to maintain social order and reduce conflicts within a community.
3. The idea of mechanical solidarity relates to shared values and collective consciousness in traditional societies.
4. Organic solidarity is based on interdependence and specialized roles in modern, complex societies.
5. Division of labour contributes significantly to the development of organic solidarity in modern societies.
6. A lack of social solidarity can lead to disintegration and conflict within a group or society.
