



# Online vs. traditional training

## POINT 01

### Efficiency Comparison

Comparison of learning outcomes between on-site and online training, for example:

- Percentage of participants who completed the training.
- Average rating of participants' achievements.
- Time needed to complete the course.

## POINT 02

### Participants' Satisfaction

Results of surveys or opinions of training participants regarding experience and effectiveness:

- Assessment of participants' satisfaction with the training.
- Participants' preferences regarding the training mode (stationary vs. online).

## POINT 03

### Knowledge Retention Indicators

Assessment of knowledge retention after training:

- The percentage of participants who retained their knowledge after a certain period of time.
- An attempt to compare the effectiveness of knowledge retention between stationary and online training participants.

## POINT 04

### Costs and Benefits

Comparison of costs and benefits of stationary and online training:

- Costs of stationary vs. online training (e.g. travel costs, accommodation, materials).
- Benefits in the form of time saved by participants and organizers.

## POINT 05

### Availability and Scalability

Examining the availability and scalability of online training compared to stationary training:

- The number of participants who can take part in online training compared to in-person training.
- Costs and time needed to organize additional training sessions.
