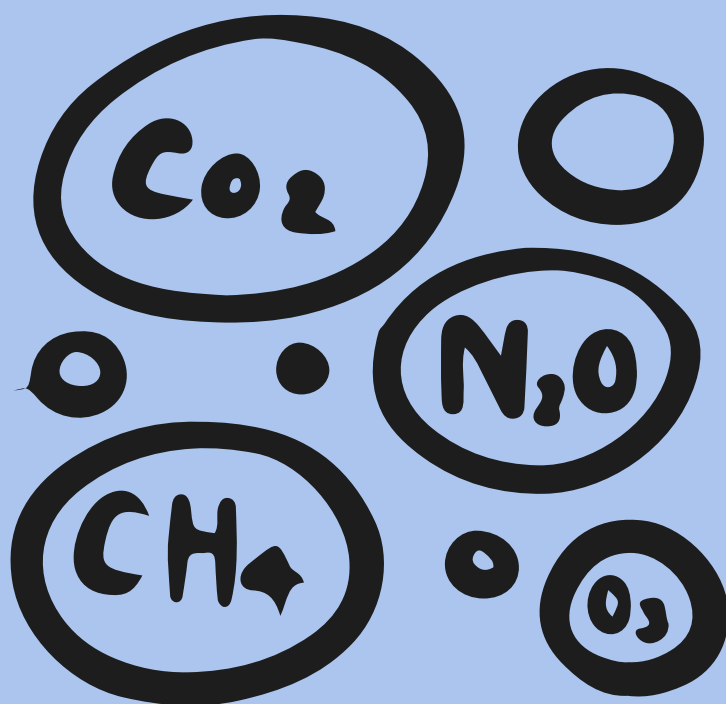


EXERCISE 2 - ANALYSIS OF THE CAUSES OF GLOBAL WARMING

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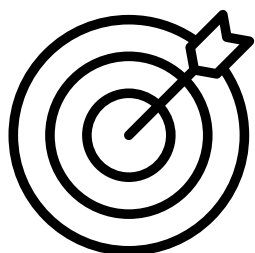


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Objective of the Exercise

To analyze and draw conclusions about the causes of global warming.

Instructions



Pair work

Divide participants into pairs. Each pair should create a table listing arguments that support the idea that human activity causes global warming, arguments against it, and any facts agreed upon by both sides of the debate.



Individual reflection:

Ask participants to write an extended piece of writing, providing an argument and conclusion about the cause(s) of global warming. Have them answer the following questions in their speech:



Do you think global warming is an immediate threat to the world? Why or why not?



Based on your opinion, what actions do you think should be taken to solve the problem of global warming? Support your opinions with specific information from your graphic organizer



Presentation to the group:

Each participant presents their position to the group



Discussion on the forum:

The moderator after all participants have presented their papers can initiate a discussion about the causes of global warming and establish points on which the whole group agrees.
