

ACTIVITY 2

LET'S DO ORIGAMI

Ask the participants to take a piece of paper and close their eyes. During this activity, ask them to refrain from asking questions and solely focus on following the instructions provided by the facilitator to complete the task. Here are the instructions:



STEP 1:

Start with a square piece of paper (A4 format). Fold the paper diagonally to form a triangle. Unfold the triangle and fold the paper in half horizontally.

Make a small cut along the folded edge, starting from the center and stopping about halfway. Unfold the paper and refold it diagonally in the opposite direction.

Make another small cut in the center.

Unfold the paper to reveal a unique symmetrical design created by the cuts.

STEP 2:

Questions for the discussion:

- How is it possible that each of you has produced different results?
- What factors contribute to these varied outcomes?
- What key insights have you gained from participating in this activity?













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Conclusion: We all interpret information through our unique sensory filters, incorporating sight, sound, touch, taste, and smell. Additionally, the inability to ask clarifying questions added an extra layer of challenge, heightening the importance of utilizing all senses to comprehend the task fully. Therefore, the ability to ask questions is crucial for achieving the right outcome.
