- **Determine** why selected methods are appropriate for a given learning outcome. Describe how a given method allows you to verify or confirm your knowledge, skills or competences.
- **Think** about how the selected methods can be applied in practice.
- **Think** about the benefits and potential challenges of using your chosen methods. Are they appropriate to the specific learning outcomes and participants' needs?

Some tips to complete the task:

- Identify your main learning goals Before you start matching validation
 methods to learning outcomes,
 consider what specific goals you want
 to achieve in the course. Do you want
 to verify your acquired knowledge,
 practical skills or developed
 competences?
- Choose appropriate validation
 methods consider a variety of
 validation methods such as written
 tests, practical tasks, simulations, peer
 assessment or work portfolios. Choose
 the ones that best suit your learning
 goals and course specifics.
- Justify your choice of methods when assigning appropriate validation
 methods to specific learning
 outcomes, explain why you think they
 are appropriate. Indicate how a given
 method will allow you to check or
 confirm your knowledge, skills or
 competences.
- Think about the practical application of methods - consider how the selected methods can be used in practice. Will they be suitable for assessing specific skills or do they require certain technical or logistical conditions?

• Assess advantages and challenges - note the advantages and potential challenges of using the selected methods. Are they adapted to the specific learning outcomes and needs of participants? Do they require additional resources or can they be used in limited conditions?

By consciously and thoughtfully matching validation methods to learning outcomes, you will be able to effectively assess your progress and achievements during the course.
