A FIBER USED FOR KNITTING, CROCHETING, OR WEAVING—USUALLY MADE OF WOOL, COTTON, OR ACRYLIC.

A MECHANICAL DEVICE USED TO JOIN FABRIC PIECES WITH THREAD FASTER AND MORE EVENLY THAN BY HAND.

AN ANCIENT METHOD OF TURNING THREAD INTO FABRIC BY CROSSING YARNS OVER AND UNDER IN PATTERNS.
